- 3. Shortage of Coaches

Shortage of officials is getting to critical stages:

- Those still officiating are getting older
- Recruitment is not going as well as we thought it would:
- National averages show of every 10 officials coming in, after 3 years 8 have dropped out
  - You will see games with fewer official in the contests.
  - Normal game nights will have to be moved to allow for officials.
  - Game times will have to be adjusted.
- Shortage of coaches:
  - Hours and pay -vs- criticism are not helping us keep coaches.

If sports are to survive we need to be flexible and aware of our behavior or schools will not offer sports as we know them now.



# **Turkey Trot**


